RECYCLE FOR LIFE & SMART RANGER PROGRAMME

TAKING YOUTHS ON A GREEN MISSION

Our Advisor PDG Kirenjit Kaur connected us to the Recycle for Life Project through Rotary Kasih with the objective of introducing Interact Clubs and Rotaract Clubs to this project. In collaboration with Global Environment Centre (GEC), MyKasih and Cenviro and with cooperation from Ministry of Education, the project was funded through a grant from Coca-Cola (USA) which benefited more than 40,000 students. 80 schools in the Klang Valley area participated in this two-year programme where some Interact Clubs took the lead and helped create environmental awareness through various activities and projects. The two-year project that ends in March 2020, is designed to address the issue of sustainable waste management. The school programme encouraged the participants to recycle using a buyback system where selected recyclables such as paper, plastic, steel, aluminium and electronic waste were purchased with cash based on the recyclable's market price. Through SMART Ranger Programme, students were taught on environmental awareness, waste management, appreciation of rivers and environmental conservation.

PROJECT BRIEFING TO ROTARY CLUBS

Youth Service Chairs and Rotarians from 20 Rotary Clubs in Klang Valley attended the briefing. Thereafter, briefings on RFL to Interact Club Councils of Rotary Clubs of RC Petaling Jaya, RC Klang, RC KL Di Raja and RC Pudu were given at their meetings.

Briefings were held continuously for Interact Club Board Members, Teacher Advisors and Rotary Club Youth Service Chairs. Training sessions followed throughout 2019.



TREE-PLANTING

MEMBERS OF ROTARY CLUB OF MELAWATI VISITED THE NORTH SELANGOR PEAT SWAMP FOREST

The monthly tree-planting activity was an annual activity organised to promote the importance of North Selangor Peat Swamp Forest to the public. This activity was aimed at conserving the various species of peat swamp and restoring the deteriorated area to its former glory, retaining the original characteristics of the peat swamp forest. It promoted environmental awareness and the tree-planting activity was designed to attract different interest groups, including children.

The participation was on a first come, first served basis, limited to 100 participants with 400-600 seedlings for each of the planting session - in one hectare area of the forest reserve. The half day activity was a collaborative effort by the Selangor State Government, Selangor Forestry Department, Friends of North Selangor Peat Swamp Forest and Global Environment Centre. The rehabilitation programme was supported by HSBC Bank Malaysia Berhad and the Selangor State Government. There was no cost to Rotary, Rotaract or Interact Clubs to participate. The seedlings were supplied by the organisers.

Total Collection Last year, from March till November 2019 (9 months), we achieved a total collection of 4,233.92 kg. This is an average of 470 kg per month.

WATER FOR PEACE

Rotary District 3300 in collaboration with LUAS (Lembaga Urus Air Selangor) launched the Rotary Peace Park Malaysia at ORS Ponds (off river storage), Kampung Hang Tuah, Bestari Jaya, Kuala Selangor on 29 June 2019.

The Rotary Peace Park Malaysia is the first in Malaysia and in Asia that offer recreational facilities for the local community, university students and the general public. The park has the potential to be a prominent eco-tourism centre with migratory birds habitat, the nearby firefly park, the peat forest of Raja Musa and the coastal mangrove forest of Kuala Selangor. Themed Water for Peace, it is part of Rotary's effort in building a greener and sustainable future.

ABOUT ROTARY PEACE PARK

ROTARY'S FOCUS AREAS

Rotary's six Areas of Focus are closely linked to the environment: PROMOTING PEACE, FIGHTING DISEASE, PROVIDING CLEAN WATER AND SANITATION, SAVING MOTHERS AND CHILDREN, SUPPORTING EDUCATION and GROWING LOCAL ECONOMIES. This Peace Park, with **Water for Peace** as the theme, is an effort by Rotary to engage with others in "doing something in our respective capacity" while uniting and encouraging everyone to take collective action towards building a more sustainable future.

WATER FOR PEACE

The UN estimates that two thirds of world population could face 'water stress' by 2025. With over one billion people faced with dire water shortages worldwide, water conflicts, human suffering and forced migrations are on the rise and will continue if not contained. The theme **Water for Peace** is hoped to be able to rally everyone in promoting efforts and avenues for a more driven and concerted action for sustainable solutions.



ROTARY WHEEL AND PEACE POLE

A peace pole will be the centre-piece on the Rotary Wheel landscape at the Rotary Peace Park. This will be the focal point for visitors. Benches and shades give the ambience of peace and tranquillity for visitors to take a breather.



WATER FOR PEACE VISITORS CENTRE

The Visitors Centre, slated for development under Phase 2 will serve as an educational platform for the local community and the public at large to learn and appreciate biodiversity. This Centre will play an active role in driving the importance of water for humanity as well as awareness on sources of river pollution.



COMMUNITY RECREATION

The Park holds a great potential in developing its social role to reach out to the local community and tourists through a unique concept of indoor and outdoor recreational activities, promoting knowledge, understanding, enjoyment, conservation effort and appreciation of the natural environment for all.



TOURISM ATTRACTION THAT SUPPORTS LOCAL ECONOMY

The park has the potential to be a prominent ecotourism centre with migratory birds habitat, the nearby firefly park at Kg Kuantan, the peat forest of Raja Musa, the historical Bukit Melawati and the coastal mangrove forest of Kuala Selangor. The spill-off from the various activities could enhance the economies of the local community.

ABOUT THE SITE

LUAS has warmly embraced Rotary's Peace Park idea and avails the use of the strategically located site adjacent to Sg. Selangor and UNISEL University Campus in Bestari Jaya. It occupies a total area of 120.80 Ha of which 63.41 Ha comprises of seven lakes. These ex-mining lakes are used to augment the raw water supply for distribution in Klang Valley, Kuala Selangor and Hulu Selangor districts. The site has been gazetted in 2013 P(W 1599) as the Alternative Water Resource Protection Zone under Section 48 LUAS Enactment 1999.

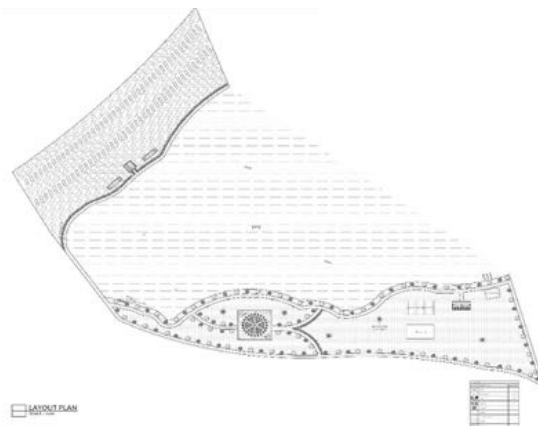

LEARNING VISIT @ FOREST RESEARCH INSTITUTE OF MALAYSIA, BIDOR

JOINED BY MEMBERS OF ROTARY CLUB OF MELAWATI, ROTARY CLUB OF IPOH SOUTH AND SOCIETY OF ECO GREATER MELAWATI (SEEGEM)

In July 1996, the Perak State Government (PSG) sanctioned an area of 121.4 ha of ex-mining land to Forest Research Institute Malaysia (FRIM) for the establishment of a research station. The urgent need for greening the tin tailings with useful tree species have been acknowledged and endorsed by the policy makers and the State Government. The location of the tin tailings is about 10 km SW of the Bidor town in Perak. The tin tailings consist of slime and sand tailings that are predominantly covered by grass and sparsely colonised by several pioneer species which is similar to the environment at the Rotary Peace Park in Bestari Jaya. The learning visit was an eye opener especially in understanding care and maintenance of plants in a challenging environment.
